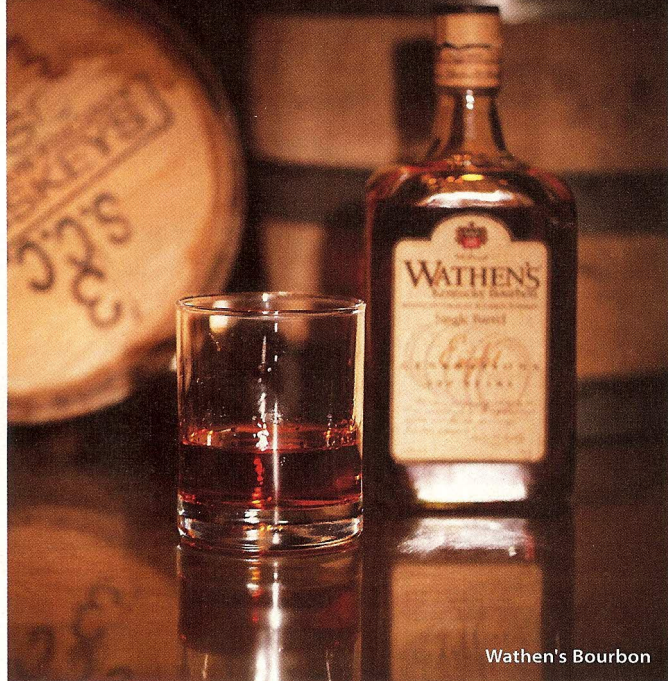

Finally! Atlanta has a bar devoted to bourbon. America's spirit has Southern roots—more than 95% of the world's bourbon is produced in Kentucky—but our city was one of the few in the southeast that lacked a bar to celebrate it. Bourbon Bar fills the void, perfectly. A stylish meeting place for after-work and pre- or post-dinner gatherings, Bourbon Bar serves up more than 70 distinct bourbons plus an array of cocktails. Head mixologist and bar manager Brian Stanger changes the drink menu every three to four months, tailoring libations to each season and featuring cocktail styles from every era including pre-Prohibition classics. "At their best, a bar can become a revered place where the weary traveler can go to find someone with whom to trade stories of the road, be revived by a well-made tonic or two and perhaps learn a bit about the local culture through its indigenous food and drinks," the menu suggests.
